### Agenda Item #6 – Receive overview of Prop 1 IRWM Implementation Grant Program

#### Recommendation

It is recommended that the Paso Basin Cooperative Committee (Committee) receive an overview of the DWR's Proposition 1 IRWM Implementation Grant Program.

#### **Prepared By**

#### **Discussion**

#### Background

Integrated Regional Water Management (IRWM) is bond-funded grant program administered by the California Department of Water Resources (DWR). The program is unique in a few ways. First, applications are made by one entity, on behalf of a single region. Our region is our County area, and the lead agency is the SLO County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (District). Eligible projects from various agencies or organizations are combined into one application and submitted to DWR by the District. The second unique feature of the program is that funding is allocated regionally, as opposed to Statewide. To the Central Coast area, the proposition allocated \$40 Million dollars. Based on this and a Memorandum of Understanding with our Central Coast partners, our County's Region is expected to receive approx. \$7.7 Million from Prop. 1 for IRWM. Our Region has been awarded ~\$4.4 Million, with the remaining ~\$3.3 Million expected to be awarded in the upcoming grant solicitation.

#### **Upcoming Grant Solicitation**

DWR is expected to release the draft guidelines for the final funding opportunity for Prop 1 IRWM grant program later this year. It is expected to be similar to the Round 1 funding opportunity. Highlights of the Round 1 opportunity were:

- Eligible entities included Cities, Counties, CSD's, 501c3's, GSA's, etc.
- Grant funds were for construction costs.
- Other funding, permits, CEQA, easements/access needed to be secured.
- Two or more benefits, preferably quantitative, not qualitative.

## Agenda Item #7 – Receive presentation on Paso Basin Aerial Groundwater Mapping Pilot Study

### Recommendation

It is recommended that the Paso Basin Cooperative Committee (Committee) receive a presentation on the Paso Basin Aerial Groundwater Mapping Pilot Study.

#### **Discussion**

#### **Background**

In August 2019, the County Board of Supervisors received and filed a presentation introducing the Paso Basin Aerial Groundwater Mapping Pilot Study. The Pilot Study was conducted as part of the Stanford Groundwater Architecture Project (GAP) and included participation by Stanford University (lead agency), the California Department of Water Resources, the State Water Resources Control Board, the Ministry of Denmark's Environmental Technology Development Program, and various consultants. The Pilot Study used state-of-the-art geophysical imaging technology, known as the aerial electromagnetic method (AEM), to essentially take an MRI of the ground to characterize subsurface geology over a portion of the Paso Basin (see Attachment 1 – Pilot Study area). This effort helped to improve understanding of the groundwater basin characteristics, including the geology, structure, layering, and connectivity of Paso Basin aquifer materials.

#### Summary of Key Pilot Study Results

The following is a brief summary of the key Pilot Study results:

- Potential groundwater recharge areas were interpreted where the AEM data, correlated with information from previous studies, well data, and the Paso Basin Groundwater Model, indicate favorable recharge characteristics of course sediments and/or sandy deposits where further investigation could be focused. These areas include the southern Creston area, San Juan Creek, Huer Huero Creek and Shedd Canyon Creek.
- **62 cross-sections** were developed to assist in interpretation and visualization of the major architecture of the geological units and structures within the study area of the Paso Basin. The cross sections show items such as potential faults, variations in geology, hydrogeologic zones and, where the Pilot Study's depth of investigation was deep enough to capture it, the bottom of the Paso Robles Formation.
- A new well database was created by digitizing data from 729 well completion reports in the study area. This database contains legacy information, collected over decades and including information about well locations, drilling details, geologic unit thicknesses, etc. in a format that can be more easily preserved, recollected, interpreted, and analyzed in the future.
