

PEI Work Plan Review

- Mental Health Awareness and Stigma Reduction (TMHA & SLOBHD)
- School-based Wellness (CAPSLO, SLOBHD, & The LINK))
- 3. Family Education and Support (Center for Family Strengthening (CFS))
- Early Care and Support for Underserved Populations (Cuesta College & Wilshire CS)
- 5. Integrated Community Wellness (Community Counseling Center, TMHA & SLOBHD)





- The Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI) component of MHSA receives 20% of the monthly revenue distribution (less 5% for Innovation)
- PEI funds should be used for programs that prevent mental illness from becoming severe and disabling. Program categories include:
 - Prevention
 - Early Intervention
 - Outreach for Increasing Recognition of Early Signs of Mental Illness
 - Stigma and Discrimination Reduction
 - Suicide Prevention
 - Access and Linkage to Treatment
 - Improve Timely Access to Services for Underserved

- FY 2016-17 Status Quo budget is \$13.9M
 (MHSA \$11M/Other Revenue \$2.9M)
 - PEI \$2.2M of budget
- Contractors given a 2.2% increase in FY 15-16
 - Working on completing the amendments this month
- PEI Prudent Reserve Balance: \$67,608
 - Stakeholders approved using these funds to contribute to the CalMHSA Statewide
 Projects for FY 2015-16 & 2016-17
 - Recommend waiting on using the funds until further discussion with DHCS

- MHSA Revenue forecast is positive for the next few years; however, the proposed No Place Like Home bond could potentially reduce future year's available revenue by 7%
- Potential revenue available for new or expanded programs beginning in FY 16/17:
 - CSS: Potential to add \$700K in expenses
 - PEI: Potential to add \$150K in expenses

- In-Home Parent Educator
 - SAFE

PEI Regulations

- Current Version
 - Approved in October 2015
 - Feedback on Language Concerns
- Proposed Changes to Regs

 - DUMI (Not for Mild/Moderates)
