### **DISCUSSION**

- We are waiting on CDPH and ASPR for formal guidance on many of this fiscal year's grant activities. We anticipate a fairly busy second half of the grant year.
- We are working to schedule a CHEMPACK training and will release more information once it is finalized.
- We have updated the Healthcare Coalition Governance document. Please review the document and send us any revision suggestions by January 9<sup>th</sup>.
   Once complete, we will send out a final copy to sign.
- Pertussis is returning to Pre-pandemic levels
  - Infants too young for vaccination are at greatest risk for lifethreatening cases of pertussis.
  - Immunize pregnant persons to prevent infant hospitalizations and deaths.
  - Prenatal immunization is the most important tool for preventing pertussis morbidity and mortality.

- Other Respiratory Viruses
  - RSV and influenza activity are increasing and are approaching moderate levels. COVID-19 is currently low in California.
  - During week 49, of the 621 viruses reported by public health laboratories, 603 were influenza A and 18 were influenza B.
- The laboratory is continuing surveillance of influenza strains in human patients, with no detections of H5N1 to date. In December, the number of overall influenza cases began to increase, after seeing low levels in October and November.
- As of December 20, 2024, the number of cases of SARS-CoV-2 has remained at low levels.
- Consistent with trends across California, the laboratory has seen an increase in detections of Mycoplasma pneumoniae in pediatric patients. The incidence of Mycoplasma pneumoniae was 4.1% (3/73) in respiratory specimens from
