- 1. Meeting Introduction and Program Updates Maya Craig-Lauer
  - OES Wildfire Community Meeting: OES hosted a public meeting to discuss wildfire readiness. We attended as representatives for Public Health and discussed the health effects of smoke.
  - Bird Flu Tabletop Summary: The exercise highlighted the importance of unified communication among healthcare partners in the event of a pandemic. We will be sending out the After Action Report (AAR).
  - MRSE: The MRSE exercise will be held on April 24<sup>th</sup> for hospitals and ambulance providers.
  - In future meetings, we will not be allowing AI notetakers in order to mitigate security risks.

## 2. HPP Updates – Sara Schwall

 All Hazard Emergency Operations Procedure (EOP) Review: We are revising the All Hazards EOP and are asking for partners to review the plan. ## 3. Wildfire Discussion – Maya Craig-Lauer

- Emma Wilcox: Something to work on is training staff on knowing how to quickly and correctly react to a wildfire emergency, knowing the specific SOP, and evacuating with no notice. A plan to assist with transportation of patients would be helpful to have. Some good information resources are the Watch Duty App and ReadySLO.org.
- Brandi Colombo: A challenge that would arise is if communications are down and
  patients in the community cannot be reached. Something that would be helpful is an
  interactive map that shows if patients are in an evacuation zone.

- OES has an interactive map with both PAZ and Evacuation Zones: <u>Find My PAZ/Evacuation Zone App</u>
- Additionally, you can sign up for emergency alerts to your phone or email through the new <u>AlertSLO</u> system developed by OES. We highly recommend all partners sign up and encourage staff, family, and friends to sign up.

## 4. Partner Roundtable

- Emma Wilcox: Last year, Sierra Vista staff went out to Diablo Canyon for a training. Transitions are still underway from Tenet to Adventist Health. This year will be the Trauma Survey and the Joint Commission Survey. Adventist Health is also working on an MCI training and an active shooter training.
- Kristine Green: Kallos Surgery is holding an active shooter training with the Sherrif's Office.
