Proposed Negative Declarations

A Negative Declaration is issued for projects that would not result in significant effects on the environment. In many cases, the project applicant has added mitigation measures to the project to reduce environmental impacts in order to qualify for a Negative Declaration. If you disagree with the issuance of a proposed Negative Declaration, you may provide comments or file a Request for Review (appeal) of the Negative Declaration. Requests for Review must be filed within two weeks of the date that the proposed Negative Declaration is posted and must address only environmental issues. There is a fee for the request. Santa Margarita Area

[DRC2018-00020 BURGETT Conditional Use Permit \(ED 19-058\)](#)

A request by Pamela Burgett for a Conditional Use Permit to establish 2,375 square feet of indoor commercial cannabis cultivation and ancillary operations to include processing activities such as drying and trimming and maintaining a supportive nursery. The project will make use of two existing greenhouses totaling 1,249 square feet and an existing 1,267-square-foot grow house. Three 320-square foot storage containers currently exist on the property and would be used for equipment storage and drying. Two new 320-square-foot storage containers are proposed adjacent to the existing greenhouses. An additional one-story 2,500-square-foot building would be constructed for the indoor cultivation as well as the supportive nursery. The project site is located at 8155 Carissa Highway, approximately 38 miles east of the community of Santa Margarita in the Carrizo Planning Area.
