- BOS Local Emergency Proclamation from 2021 – 2023



State Background



The Atlantic. Lake Oroville on 19 Aug. 2014

- 2012-2016 California Drought
 - Near record breaker
 - Highlighted need for planning
- SB-606 & AB-1668 signed in 2018
 - Drought resilience requirements for urban & rural areas
- **SB-552** signed in 2021
 - Additional requirements for rural areas



State Goals for SB-552

Water Code 10609.50:

"(a) Droughts are predicted to become more frequent, longer, and more severe as climate change progresses, putting drinking water supplies at risk of running dry or becoming contaminated."



Reduce the risk of water shortage for small water suppliers, state small water systems and individual wells



Improve financial and technical resource access



Promote proactive planning, coordination, and collaboration





- Advisory resource for counties to utilize in their development of their SB-552 Drought Resilience Plans




Figure 1-1 – General Workflow for the County Drought Resilience Plan Development and Implementation


