Kari shared the most current HMIS Staff report snapshot, which consists of 17 participating HMIS agencies, 244 current users, 113 projects, and an average of 80 users accessing HMIS each day. She also mentioned that HMIS Helpdesk received 828 messages since the last Committee meeting, and 55 percent of these messages were resolved on the first reply.

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McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act

Children who lack a *fixed*, *regular*, *and adequate* nighttime residence.

Fixed = stationary, permanent, and not subject to change.
 Regular = used on a normal, standard, and consistent basis.
 Adequate = sufficient for meeting both the physical and psychological needs typically met in home environments.




San Luis Obispo County Homeless Student Enrollment by Dwelling Type



San Luis Obispo County Homeless Student Enrollment by Dwelling Type




DataQuest 2023-24 Homeless Student by Dwelling Type San Luis Obispo County





California: San Luis Obispo County Child and Youth Homelessness 2022-23




