1. Call to Order and Introductions

Michelle S. called the meeting to order at 3:07 pm. Introductions were made by Kellie Hoover from Good Samaritan, and Devon McQuade from 5 Cities Homeless Coalition.

2. Public Comment

None shared.

3. Consent: Approval of Minutes

Jack moved the motion for approval of the minutes. Brenda seconded the motion. The minutes were approved unanimously by voice vote.

4. Action/Information/Discussion

4.1. HSOC Administration

4.1.1. Discussion Item: HSOC Membership and By-laws

Laurel briefly shared that the expiring HSOC membership seats will be announced at the HSOC meeting in September. An email will be sent to those whose terms are expiring at the end of this year to let them know it is time to reapply or help find someone to fill their seat. Applications can be submitted online on the HSOC website by the end of next month to have enough time to convene an Ad hoc Nominating Committee to make recommendations to the Executive Committee for consideration in October. She also mentioned that there are two vacant seats, one of which is the Veteran's seat which has been vacant for several months. An application for this seat was received from someone who works for CAPSLO. However, there are currently two members on the HSOC who also work for CAPSLO. According to the HSOC By-laws, there cannot be more than two representatives from one agency. Laurel asked the group's thoughts if they would want to consider amending the Bylaws. Michelle S. suggested never changing the By-laws because of a particular situation and just leaving the Veteran's seat open for now and instead recruiting for this seat at the beginning of the next round of applications. Her other thought is that allowing more people from an organization could affect the quorum when there are recusals required for certain funding allocations, etc. The committee has agreed that for now, the By-laws stand as it is.

4.2. Implementing Five-Year Plan Line of Effort 1 – Create Affordable and Appropriately Designed Housing Opportunities and Shelter Options for Underserved Populations

4.2.1. Discussion Item: 2025 Continuum of Care Program Update

Laurel gave a brief update on the CoC grant. She shared that NOFO (Notice of Funding Opportunity) still has not come out and may come out between August and November. The application to HUD will likely be due six to twelve weeks after NOFO publication, but there is still significant uncertainty. So, in preparation, she mentioned they are going to release a Notice of Interest document to ask groups interested in applying to submit some documentation to help screen for minimum qualifications and requirements. There will be a pre-NOFO information session on September 3 to discuss changes announced by HUD (U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development)

4.3. Implementing Five-Year Plan Line of Effort 2: Reduce or Eliminate Barriers to Housing Stability

4.3.1. Discussion Item: Federal Grants and Entitlement Program Update Laurel presented slides showing updates on Federal grant appropriations, and Entitlement programs specifically Medical/CalFresh benefits. She also provided an information sheet containing a summary of upcoming State/Federal changes.

Michelle Shoresman also mentioned that on their website, CenCal has an information page regarding Medi-Cal benefits changes.

4.4. Implementing Five-Year Plan Line of Effort 3 – Improve and Expand Data Management Efforts Through HMIS and Coordinated Entry System to Strengthen Data-Driven Operational Guidance and Strategic Oversight

4.4.1. Discussion Item: System Performance Measures

Kate shared information sheet about the HUD SPM submitted last federal fiscal year. Slides included Measure # 1: Length of Time persons remain homeless data; Measure #2: Returns

to homelessness for people who exit to permanent housing destinations; Measure #3: Number of Homeless Persons; Measure #4: Employment and Income growth for homeless persons in CoC funded programs; 5: Number of persons who become homeless for the first time; Measure #7: Successful Placement from street outreach into permanent housing.

4.5. Discussion Item: Future Agenda Items for HSOC

None discussed.

4.6. Information Item: Committee Reports

Kari reported on behalf of Jack Lahey. She shared that Lawren Ramos chaired the last Coordinated entry Committee meeting and covered topics such as inventory model configured for CAPSLO housing. The CE team have also launched a referral queue for emergency shelter. There will also be a community of wide forms for consistency and improvements., etc.

Mark chaired the Data & Performance Committee meeting on behalf of Janna and shared that the minimum intake form was approved at the last meeting. He also shared that Jack had a presentation on Safe parking program and Kate presented on Performance metrics. The Services Coordinating Committee has not met yet. The next meeting is scheduled for September 8.

4.7. Information Item: Updates from County Staff on County Initiatives

George reported that yesterday, the HCD (Housing and Community Development) announced a \$34 million Multi-Family Accelerator award for People's Self-Help Housing's Del Rio Ridge affordable housing project in Atascadero. He shared that this is funding from HUD's Community Development Block Grant and will create 42 units of affordable housing. In addition, George also reported that the Homeless Services Division released a Request for Proposal (RFP) on August 7th. The RFP included \$6.5 million in funding for housing and homeless services and applications are due Friday, August 29th.

George also shared the Division will be releasing the 2026Action Plan NOFA (Notice of Funds Availability) in early September, which has an estimated \$2.7 million available for application.

He also mentioned that the Division have been partnering with the Department of Planning and Building to propose a regional housing incentive fund, aimed to fund affordable housing developments. The proposal is going to the Board of Supervisors for initial feedback on September 23.

Jeff reported that construction on the Welcome Home Village has started. He shared that Good Samaritan is looking at hiring one more person to help with community outreach duties.

He also reported that there are two new warming center locations, namely in Morro Bay and Paso Robles. In addition, Jeff also mentioned that the blue bag program is being launched in the Paso Robles and Five Cities areas.

Laurel shared that Linda gave a Division update to the Board of Supervisors on August 5th.

ITEM: Vote to Recommend Twelve Persons for Appointment to the Homeless Services Oversight Council for a Term Beginning January 1, 2026

ACTION REQUIRED: It is requested that the Homeless Services Oversight Council (HSOC) Executive Committee: approve the nominations of Jack Lahey for an additional term for the At Large seat he currently holds, in the category of Nonprofit Homeless Assistance Provider; Luke Dunn for a term in the category of Currently or Formerly Homeless Persons; Mark Lamore to renew his term for the Nonprofit Homeless Services Agencies seat he currently holds; James Davis for a first term for the Organizations Serving Homeless Veterans seat currently vacant; Wendy Blacker for a term for an At Large seat; Frank Warren for the County Government Service Provider seat currently held by Star Graber; Daniel Suttles for the Public Safety Organization seat previously held by Jeff Smith; Michelle Pedigo for a second term for the Housing Authority seat she currently holds; Rick Gulino for the Affordable Housing Developer seat he currently holds; Margaret Shephard-Moore for the Advocate seat she currently holds; Devon McQuade for the Nonprofit Homeless Assistance Providers seat previously held by Janna Nichols; and Wendy Blacker for an At Large seat; and Rosie Ojeda for the Local School Districts seat; and recommend them to the Homeless Services Oversight Council for appointment.

SUMMARY NARRATIVE:

There are 37 membership seats on the HSOC. Members are appointed to the HSOC by the County Board of Supervisors, except for seven seats reserved for the representatives of the seven incorporated cities. These seven seats are held by City Council members who are appointed by their respective City Councils.

Except for the seats reserved for elected officials, and the Youth Advisory Board seat, members are appointed to three-year terms. To ensure continuity of the HSOC, term expirations are staggered among the seats, such that approximately 1/3 of the seats expire in a given year. Terms expire in January of the year, when the term ends. There is no restriction on the number of terms a member may serve.

There are currently eleven seats due to expire in January 2026. Nine of these seats are tied to a specific category and can only be held by a representative from that category. The two remaining seats are At Large seats, meaning they may be held by a representative from any of the following categories: County Government Service Providers, Currently or Formerly Homeless Persons, Advocates, Affordable Housing Developers, Businesses, Faith-Based Organizations, Hospitals, Public Safety Organizations, Behavioral Health Agencies, Nonprofit Homeless Assistance Providers, Organizations Serving Homeless Veterans, Housing Authority, County Office of Education, Local School Districts, Social Service Providers, Victim Service Providers, and Other Community Organizations.

In addition to the expiring seat, there is a vacancy for the Organizations Serving Homeless Veterans seat. While nominations to fill vacant seats are not required to come before the Executive Committee before going to the full HSOC, the Executive Committee at its August meeting asked that applications for that seat be considered as part of the process of making nominations for expiring seats. This seat became vacant partway through its term, so it will have a different expiration date (January 2028) than the remainder of the seats.

At the September 2025 HSOC meeting, expiring membership terms were reviewed and a request was made for applications from the public. A total of fourteen applications were received. An ad hoc Nominating Committee met in October to consider the applications and recommended the following twelve candidates for seats on the HSOC for terms beginning in January 2026:

Jack Lahey for an additional term for the At Large seat he currently holds for a term expiring in January 2029. Jack is currently the Chair of the HSOC Coordinated Entry Committee. He is the Director of Homeless Services for the Community Action Partnership of San Luis Obispo (CAPSLO).

Luke Dunn for the Currently or Formerly Homeless Person seat for a term that will expire January 2029. Luke works for CAPSLO's Outreach and Engagement Team. Luke currently serves on the HSOC in an At Large seat.

Mark Lamore for the Nonprofit Homeless Assistance Providers seat for a term that will expire in January 2029. Mark is the Director of Homeless Services and Housing at Transitions Mental Health Association (TMHA). Mark currently serves on the HSOC and was previously the Chair of the HSOC Data and Performance Committee.

James Davis for the Organizations Serving Homeless Veterans seat for a term that will expire January 2028. James is an Air Force veteran and served as a volunteer consultant to Ride On Transportation/UCP+ of SLO County, develop, producing and promoting various fundraising events, including the annual Veterans Benefit Concert,

benefitting the Veterans Express Shuttle that transports Veterans to medical, dental, and vision appointments. He operates a concert event and fund development company called Festival After Dark and a podcasting and media company. He previously worked as a residential care facility administrator, developing and overseeing programs that helped provide long term supported housing for mentally ill persons experiencing homelessness.

Frank Warren for the County Government Service Provider seat for a term that will expire in January 2029. Frank is the Deputy Director of the County of San Luis Obispo Behavioral Health Department and has worked for the Department for 31 years. He oversees Divisions at the Department that provide direct and indirect services and partner with organizations that serve unhoused persons and those at risk of homelessness in San Luis Obispo County.

Daniel Suttles for the Public Safety Organizations seat for a term that will expire January 2029. He is the Chief of Police for the City of Atascadero. In this role, he has overseen Departmental collaboration with community partners such as County Behavioral Health, ECHO, and the Wisdom Center to help bring resources to people experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness in Atascadero.

Michelle Pedigo for the Housing Authority seat, for a term expiring in January 2029. Michelle serves as the Executive Director of the Housing Authority of San Luis Obispo (HASLO). She is currently a member of the HSOC and serves on the HSOC Executive Committee.

Rick Gulino for the Affordable Housing Developers seat for a term that will expire January 2029. Rick is the Director of Resident Services at People's Self-Help Housing. Rick is a current member of the HSOC and has served as the Chair of the SLO Supportive Housing Consortium for over ten years.

Margaret Shephard-Moore for the Advocate seat for a term that will expire January 2029. Margaret is a staff member at Transitions Mental Health Association, working as a homeless outreach social worker. Margaret also works part-time for the County of San Luis Obispo's Homeless Services Division as the Project Manager for the Welcome Home Village project. She currently serves on the HSOC.

Devon McQuade for the Nonprofit Homeless Assistance Providers seat for a term that will expire January 2029. Devon is the Associate Director of the 5Cities Homeless Coalition and is the incoming Executive Director effective January 1, 2026. Devon has worked with 5CHC for over eight years, serving in a variety of roles from case management to operations and administration.

Action Item 4.1.2

Wendy Blacker for an At Large seat for a term that will expire January 2029. Wendy is the Founder and CEO of 805 Street Outreach, which serves unhoused persons in San Luis Obispo County and operates a shower program for unhoused persons in Morro Bay. Wendy also has lived experience of homelessness in San Luis Obispo County.

Rosie Ojeda for the Local School Districts seat for a term that will expire January 2029. Rosie is an Assistant Professor at Cal Poly. Rosie grew up in San Luis Obispo County, attending school in the Lucia Mar School District and then teaching in Santa Maria. Her work at Cal Poly includes teaching incoming teachers about how they can help and be aware of students experiencing homelessness.

BUDGET/FINANCIAL IMPACT

No current fiscal impact is anticipated.

It is recommended that the Homeless Services Oversight Council Executive Committee approve this item. Upon HSOC's approval, staff will submit a recommendation for appointment to the full HSOC.

Please describe how you qualify for the HSOC category which you have selected above:

I qualify for the nonprofit homeless assistance organization seat through my extensive leadership and direct program experience in the homeless services sector. For the past 14 years, I have served as the Director of Homeless Services for Good Samaritan Shelter, overseeing multiple shelter programs across Santa Barbara County and leading the upcoming opening of a new shelter in San Luis Obispo. In addition, I have managed the Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) program for over eight years in both San Luis Obispo and Santa Barbara Counties.

My experience also includes operating a state-serving safe house for survivors of human trafficking and directing homeless street outreach teams in both counties for over a decade. Prior to my work with Good Samaritan, I worked in social services for the County of Santa Barbara and with foster youth and other youth organizations in both San Luis Obispo and Santa Barbara Counties.

I bring a strong background in policy and program implementation, coupled with ongoing professional development through annual participation in the National Conference on Homelessness in Washington, D.C., as well as other statewide and regional trainings. I am frequently invited to speak as a subject matter expert for schools, service organizations, and community forums, providing education and advocacy around homelessness.

Through this combination of direct program management, regional experience, and policy expertise, I am well-positioned to contribute meaningfully to the HSOC as a representative of nonprofit homeless assistance organizations.

While not necessarily required, knowledge of issues relating to homelessness and/or previous involvement in addressing homelessness are desirable for HSOC members and will be considered by the selection committee prior to making its recommendations to the Board of Supervisors. Please summarize your experience with the issue of homelessness or with homeless clients:

My work has given me extensive, direct experience with individuals and families experiencing homelessness across multiple settings. Over the years, I have worked alongside clients in emergency shelters, safe houses, and on the streets, helping them navigate barriers such as mental health challenges, substance use, unemployment, and the lack of affordable housing. I have overseen outreach teams in San Luis Obispo and Santa Barbara Counties for more than a decade, ensuring that unsheltered individuals are connected to shelter, healthcare, and permanent housing resources.

In addition, I have managed programs specifically designed for vulnerable populations, including veterans and survivors of human trafficking, both of whom face unique pathways into and out of homelessness. Through this work, I have witnessed the resilience of clients and the importance of trauma-informed, client-centered approaches.

Beyond direct service, I also bring governance and policy experience from my role as the 4th District Commissioner on the Santa Barbara County Human Services Commission. In this capacity, I reviewed and made funding recommendations for programs addressing poverty, homelessness, and basic needs, and worked to ensure county resources were directed toward the most effective community-based solutions.

This combination of front-line service, program management, and policy-level decision-making has allowed me to develop a well-rounded understanding of the issues and solutions that are most effective in addressing homelessness in our region.

Please explain why you would like to serve on the HSOC (attach a separate sheet if necessary):

I would like to serve on the HSOC because I am deeply committed to advancing collaborative and effective solutions to homelessness in our region. Over the past 14 years as Director of Homeless Services for Good Samaritan Shelter, I have seen firsthand how critical it is for service providers, county partners, and community stakeholders to align their efforts in order to create meaningful pathways out of homelessness. Serving on the HSOC would allow me to contribute my experience and perspective at a policy and planning level, while also ensuring that the voices and needs of our most vulnerable community members are represented.

Good Samaritan Shelter is also expanding its footprint in San Luis Obispo County. With the upcoming Welcome Home Village project in San Luis Obispo, concentrated street outreach efforts across the county, and the continued growth of our veteran services, we are building deeper roots in this community. Serving on the HSOC would provide an important opportunity to align our work with countywide priorities, strengthen partnerships, and contribute to the shared goal of reducing homelessness in San Luis Obispo County.

Ultimately, my motivation to serve comes from a commitment to both practical solutions and long-term systems change. I believe my background in direct service, program management, and regional collaboration would be an asset to the HSOC as it continues to guide policy, funding, and strategies to address homelessness.

Per the HSOC bylaws (November 3, 2020), one seat is reserved for a County Supervisor, and seven seats are reserved for an elected City Councilperson from each of the incorporated cities.

*Five 'at large seats' may be held by representatives from any of the following categories: County Government Service Providers, Currently or Formerly Homeless Persons, Advocates, Affordable Housing Developers, Businesses, Faith-Based Organizations, Hospitals, Public Safety Organizations, Behavioral Health Agencies, Nonprofit Homeless Assistance Providers, Organizations Serving Homeless Veterans, Housing Authority, County Office of Education, Local School Districts, Social Service Providers, Victim Service Providers, and Other Community Organizations.

The HSOC may have no more than two representatives, staff or Board members from the same agency or organization.



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Trump admin looks at deep cuts to homeless housing program

A new policy change will significantly cut funding used to place people experiencing homelessness in permanent housing.

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The Trump administration is expected to dramatically cut funding for a permanent housing program — a move that could potentially reexpose tens of thousands of people to homelessness.

More than half of the 2026 funding for the Department of Housing and Urban Development's homelessness program designated for permanent housing projects will be cut and moved to transitional housing assistance with some work or service requirements, according to three HUD employees and a person with inside knowledge of the Continuum of Care program as well as internal HUD documents obtained by POLITICO confirming the cuts. All the people were granted anonymity to discuss sensitive matters.

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"When the subsidy and the support that goes along with those subsidies is removed, it puts people at grave risk," said the person with inside knowledge of the CoC program. "And most of these folks without these supports will likely end up back in emergency shelters or back on our nation's streets."

The program partners with communities to provide housing and services to sheltered and unsheltered people with the goal of moving them into permanent housing. It often benefits families with children, and those who have experienced homelessness in the past in combination with being chronically ill or having a disability. The cuts could have a greater impact on rural areas that have less access to city and state dollars to supplement federal funding, the people said.

"HUD is no longer in the business of permanently funding homelessness without measuring program success at promoting recovery and self-sufficiency. There will be more news on this much needed paradigm shift soon," said a HUD spokesperson.

The change to the policy is the latest example of how the Trump administration is placing new rules on government benefits, often requiring work or other requirements for people seeking to tap federal subsidies. But those close to the program say the new policy could have severe repercussions, leaving those utilizing these services in a more dire situation if they have young children at home or are unable to work for a reason not recognized by the government as an exemption.

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Currently, 87 percent of all CoC program funds ending in 2026 are slated to support permanent housing in some capacity. Under the policy change, only 30 percent of the funds will be allowed to be used for that purpose.

The available funding for permanent housing for calendar year 2026 is currently at \$3.3 billion, but would be cut to less than half of that at around \$1.1 billion once the policy change is implemented, according to the internal HUD data. Additionally, President Donald Trump's budget for fiscal 2026 proposed cutting funding to the entire CoC program.

The funding cap, which is expected to be introduced through a Notice of Funding Opportunity in the coming weeks, is considered "the worst-case scenario" and will be "devastating," the people said.

Typically, any change like this would go through HUD's attorneys to ensure it complied with the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act, which created the program. The law requires the CoC program to work, primarily at a local level, to end homelessness and requires both renewable and nonrenewable funding to provide a variety of housing resources, including permanent housing, primarily for families and those with disabilities.

However, two of the HUD employees said they were forbidden from speaking with the agency's attorneys, and there is concern that the funding cap raises legal questions about its compliance with the law.

"We had no indication that there would be anything like this and no indication that the program would be administered this irresponsibly. We just did not see this coming," one of the HUD employees said.

Additionally, those administering the programs through local organizations have been left in the dark, as two HUD employees said they were not allowed to share any details about the expected policy change.

The new criteria will also deduct points for projects if the organization applying for federal funding has previously used racial preferences or recognized transgender people.
