

Current State

- Unsheltered homelessness: people living and sleeping in places not intended for longterm habitation
 - In vehicles
 - Beneath underpasses & bridges
 - o On sidewalks
 - In open spaces
- Taxpayer Cost:
 - \$30k to \$50k per person per year
 - Considering only SLO City, taxpayers are paying \$7 to \$12 million per year*

Current State

- Bob Jones Bike Trail
- 274 Transient Incident Reports from 2020-2022
- Ongoing concerns:
 - Safety
 - Environmental risks
 - Local services over capacity

The Opportunity

- State announced \$199 million in Encampment Resolution Fund awards
 - \$13.4 million awarded to County of SLO for the encampments along the Bob Jones Bike Trail (BJBT)
- California prioritizing encampment *resolutions*
 - Funding "rapid deployment" proposals
- Key Outcomes:
 - Reduce unsheltered homelessness found along BJBT
 - Find them stable & safe housing
 - Cut incidents & LEO response needs
 - o Improve **environmental health** of San Luis Creek

 - Behavioral health assessments
 - Psychiatric assessments
 - Paramedic support
 - Public safety

- Restore the watershed corridor & open space
- Environmental clean-up
- Improve resilience to fire & flooding
- Reduce littering & hazards
 - Bear-proof trashcans
 - o Portable restroom
- Prioritized patrol

The Solution ()

- Welcome Home Village
- Non-congregate supportive housing community
 - o 34 interim beds
 - 46 permanent beds
- Prioritize referrals from the BJBT corridor
- Modular & reconfigurable

- 6 Months to clean up





Who did Dignity Moves Serve in Year 1?

- 78% experiencing chronic homelessness, at least one permanent disabling condition, and at least 12 months homeless
 - o 74% mental health disorder
 - 43% substance use disorder
 - 55% chronic health condition
 - 12% development disability
 - 26% physical disability



- o 73 persons have entered the project
- 34 are currently residing there
- Approximately 7 persons declined to enter
- Average age is 54

Avg. Time Unhoused Before Dignity Moves: 7 years

What did Dignity Moves Accomplish in Year 1?

- 48% have connected to mental health services
- 23% have connected to substance abuse disorder services

28 have moved on to permanent housing, primarily to a rental unit


- 5 moved to an institutional setting
- 4 either reunited with family or entered another interim housing program

 First people move into permanent supportive housing







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State-Funded Encampment Resolution Efforts

• **57 proposals** awarded by State (so far)

• **5** awards to neighboring counties

Funded proposals prioritized

Large encampments (50+ people)

- Scalable encampment solutions
- Safe, stable & local housing
