
Re: MADISON, SHANE, ANTHONY - CDCR # G31262

Dear Board:

We are in receipt of a letter dated February 16, 2016 regarding the above-named inmate being considered for early parole release after serving 50% of his sentence.

It is the position of the San Luis Obispo District Attorney's Office that early parole release be **denied**. Inmate MADISON presents a substantial danger to public safety.

It is only by virtue of the Court striking a strike prior that Inmate MADISON is being considered for early parole release. Notwithstanding the stricken strike prior, Inmate MADISON's behavior can best be described as dangerous and defiant. He has accumulated 15 prior convictions as an adult including, but not limited to, violations of Penal Code Section 211, Penal Code Section 459, 1<sup>st</sup> Degree, Penal Code Section 12020(a), Penal Code Section 242, Penal Code Section 148(a)(1) and Health and Safety Section 11550(a). Two particular entries are worth noting: (1) Inmate MADISON escaped from a San Luis Obispo jail, not once, but twice in 1993 and 1998 with unknown force and violence and (2) Inmate MADISON served as a look out during a first degree robbery while his co-defendants pushed the victim down, put a gun to his head, demanded money, and hog-tied his hands and feet, leaving scars to his wrists and ankles.
