

# Guide to Free, Confidential COVID-19 Testing

for farm workers

# Now is Your Opportunity

Do you think you may have been exposed to Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19)? You can get tested for free, even if you don't have symptoms.



### How to Get Tested

### Public Health Testing at Work

The County Public Health Department can come to you! Talk to your employer about bringing testing to your workplace. Public Health will only collect your name, date of birth and contact information so they can let you know your test results. Employers can request testing at their workplace by calling (805) 781-5500.

### **CHC** Testing

Community Health Centers (CHC) is waiving all costs for medically necessary screening and testing for COVID-19 (coronavirus). Visit **www.communityhealthcenters.org** or call (866) 614-4636.

### How does testing work?

- ✓ Pick a location. Depending on the testing location, you can either walk in or you may have to make an appointment.
- ✓ Show up. A health care worker will greet you and swab the inside of your nose. The test should take a few minutes from start to finish.
- ✓ Get your results. It can take anywhere from 1 to 6 days to get your test results, depending on where you get tested.



# What happens if your test comes back positive?

If you test positive, you may not be able to work until you're well. But there is help available during that time.

### **Get Paid When Sick**


Even if you test positive for coronavirus and cannot work, you can still get paid. Food sector workers and agriculture workers - including farm workers and growers – may qualify for up to two weeks of paid sick leave for COVID-19 related reasons (part-time workers may not get the full 80 hours).

### Get Lodging and Food When Sick

The County of San Luis Obispo can help coordinate lodging and food to support any farm workers diagnosed with COVID-19. County staff will work with farm workers or their employers to get temporary housing to ensure the safety and well-being of the farm worker and their housemates. 

### lf you test positive, you may qualify for:



Public Health will be in touch with you daily to monitor your health if you test positive for COVID-19.

NOTE: These tests can only detect if someone has COVID-19 at the time of testing. The test cannot detect past infection of COVID-19. It also does not detect whether a person is immune or has antibodies to COVID-19.
