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WHAT'S NEW THIS ELECTION

SEMI-OPEN PRIMARY ELECTION

There are 6 qualified parties in California: American Independent, Democratic, Green, Libertarian, Peace and Freedom and Republican. In this primary election, candidates for partisan offices (Federal and State) will only be on the ballot for the party with which they are registered and voters who are registered with a qualified party must vote that party ballot. Candidates for non-partisan offices (State Superintendent of Public Instruction, County and City offices) and the State and Local measures will be on every party ballot as well as the non-partisan ballot. Voters who have declined to state a party affiliation or are registered with a party that is not qualified in California may choose a party ballot if that party is allowing non-affiliated voters to vote in their primary. For this election, the Democratic and Republican parties are allowing non-affiliated voters to vote in their primary, with the exception of the party's central committee contests.

COST CUTTING MEASURES

As the County struggles with budget deficits, we continue to look for ways to cut election costs, while maintaining a high level of service to our voters.

Permanent Vote-by-Mail Voters and Voters within Mail Ballot Precincts will only receive one mailing from the County.


The sample ballot booklet mailed to each voter contains a copy of their ballot, candidate statements and information on local measures as well as notification of the voter's polling place and an application for a vote-by-mail ballot. This booklet was mailed to every voter whether they were signed up to vote by mail or not. For this and future elections, we have designed a vote by mail insert which includes all the information in the sample ballot booklet, except notification of the polling place assigned to the voter and the application for a vote by mail ballot. The 75,000 voters who are signed up as permanent vote-by-mail or reside in a mail ballot precinct for this election will be mailed this insert along with their vote-by-mail ballot. This insert saves costs since it contains fewer pages than the booklet making it less expensive to print and by inserting it with the vote by mail ballot, postage for the separate mailing for these voters is eliminated. In addition, voters will receive all the information on the local candidates and measures at the same time as their ballot. Every voter household will also receive the state voter information guide which contains all the information on the state propositions, including the full text and the arguments supporting and opposing the measure.

Ballots will be counted at the Elections Office.

To further save costs on delivery and testing of the voting machines, the AccuVote ballot scanner will not be deployed to the polling places. Since the ballots are being counted after the polls close, the results from San Luis Obispo County will be available much later on Election night, although we are predicting that the count will be complete by 1:00 a.m. The Automark ballot marking machine will continue to be available at the polls to assist voters with disabilities in marking their ballots.

ACCESSIBILITY FEATURES AVAILABLE ON WEBSITE

With funding from a Help America Voter Act grant, the County Clerk-Recorder has photographed all polling places in the county and documented the accessibility features, including parking, path of travel and equipment that can be used by voters with special needs to access their polling place. Voters will also be able to view a sample of their ballot and get directions to their polling place. These features can be found in the polling place lookup feature on the Clerk-Recorder's website (www.slocounty.ca.gov/clerk) and will be a valuable tool to help voters easily identify their polling place and how to navigate to the room where the polls are located.



WEBSITE TRACKING OF VOTE-BY-MAIL BALLOTS

Voters can now track their vote-by-mail status on the County Clerk-Recorder's website at www.slocounty.ca.gov/clerk. The voter is required to enter their voter information exactly as it is entered in the voter registration system and if a match is found, their vote-by-mail ballot status information will be displayed, including: date ballot was issued, date ballot was received in the office and whether the ballot has been challenged for any reason. This system will be updated daily through the certification of the election. If the voter is unable to find the information on the web, they can continue to contact our office by phone at 781-5228.

INSUFFICIENT CANDIDATES

Party Central Committee and County Council Contests

The Elections Code provides that if, for any central committee or county council contest, the number of candidates who have filed papers is less than or equal to the number of positions available, the candidates will not be placed on the ballot and will be appointed in lieu of election. Any candidate so appointed shall serve as though he or she was elected. Most central committee and county council contests had insufficient candidates and will not be on the ballot, with the exception of the Democratic Party Central Committee representing the 2nd 3rd and 4th Supervisorial Districts.

Superior Court Judges

If only the incumbent has filed nomination papers for the office of Superior Court Judge, his or her name will not appear on the ballot unless a petition indicating that a write in campaign will be conducted is filed within 10 days after the close of nominations. No such petitions were filed for the 3 Superior Court judicial offices and therefore the incumbent judges names will not appear on the ballot.

PLACEMENT ON THE BALLOT/ROTATION OF CANDIDATES

The order in which candidates' names appear on the ballot is determined by a random drawing of the 26 letters of the alphabet. This random drawing is conducted by the Secretary of State and the County Clerk-Recorder prior to each election. The random drawing for the June 8, 2010 election was held on March 18.

Election law also requires the names of candidates for some offices to change positions, such as federal, statewide and county wide offices (i.e. Governor, United States Senator, Secretary of State, United States Representative and Sheriff). The purpose of the rotation is so one candidate's name does not always appear first, or last, on <u>all</u> of the ballots for the races.

As required by state law, names of candidates for certain offices are rotated on the ballot as follows:

OFFICE	ROTATION
Statewide Offices, United States Representative, Board of Equalization member	Candidates' names are arranged in accordance with the alphabetical drawing beginning with the lowest numbered Assembly District in the State or Congressional or Board of Equalization District. Thereafter, for each succeeding Assembly District, the candidate's name appearing first is placed last; the order of the other names remains unchanged. Since San Luis Obispo County is

	represented by only one Assembly District, these candidates will be in the same order on every ballot in this county.
State Assembly	For multi-county districts, such as the 33rd Assembly (San Luis Obispo and Santa Barbara) each county conducts a random drawing and the candidates' names are arranged in accordance with each county's alphabetical drawing- no other rotation.
Sheriff-Coroner	Candidates' names are arranged in accordance with the alphabetical drawing in the 1st District. Thereafter for each succeeding Supervisorial District, the candidate's name appearing first is placed last and the order of the other names remains unchanged. With 6 candidates, a different name will be placed first in each of the supervisorial districts.

VOTE -BY- MAIL BALLOT INFORMATION

History: Absentee ballots were first made available by the North for the soldiers and sailors in the Civil War. California first allowed absentee voting in 1920 for those who were ill or disabled, lived too far from the polls and other special circumstances. In 1978 legislation was passed which allowed universal absentee voting. As a result of this change allowing any person to vote absentee (now vote-by-mail), it has become a very popular means to cast a ballot. See the chart on page 8 to track the trend of voters casting their ballots by mail. In 2002, permanent absentee voting was expanded to any voter upon request. There are currently over 71,000 permanent vote-by-mail voters in San Luis Obispo County, more than 45% of the total registered voters.

How To Apply for a Vote-by-Mail Ballot:

The first day this office can issue a vote-by-mail ballot for the Primary Election is May 10, 2010 (29 days before the election). Vote-by-mail ballot requests must be received no later than June 1st in order for the ballot to be mailed to the voter. After that date the voter must appear in the Office of the County Clerk-Recorder and complete an application indicating the reason they cannot appear at the polls on Election day. Vote-by-mail ballots may be requested in one of four ways:

Vote-by-mail ballots cannot be requested over the telephone as a written request from the voter is required.

The deadline to request that a ballot be MAILED is E-7; June 1. After that date a voter must be present in the office to request a ballot or they can designate, in writing, someone to pick up their ballot for them.

To be counted, the voted ballot must be mailed in time to be received by the County Clerk-Recorder's office by 8:00 p.m. on June 8, 2010 or returned by the voter personally to any polling place in the county no later than 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. It is recommended that voters do not mail ballots after the Friday prior to the election to ensure that the ballot will be received in time to be counted. The voter may also authorize a designated family member to return the voted ballot to any polling place in the county or to the County Clerk-Recorder's Office.

WEEKEND VOTING

The County Clerk-Recorder's Office will be open on the Saturday before the election from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. to issue vote-by-mail ballots. Voters may vote the ballot in the office at the voting booths or have a family member return the ballot for them by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.

PREPARING FOR THE ELECTION THE READER'S DIGEST VERSION E-120 TO ELECTION DAY

The staff of the County Clerk-Recorder's Office begins preparation for a county wide election at least four months prior to election day and after that every day is counted as E-the number of days left. You could ask any employee in our office (and probably any candidate) how many days until the election and we won't even have to think twice to answer. Some of the important dates and the activities surrounding them are:

E minus number	Date	Activity
E-113	February 15	Opening of the nomination period.
E-88	March 12	Close of the nomination period. After the close of nomination, the ballot layout and preparation begins. Proofing of the sample ballots and

		ballot information continues through early April. The vote-by-mail ballots are received by the beginning of May and the sample ballot mailing is completed around the same time.
E-60	April 9	60 day close. This is the initial target date for ensuring that the voter rolls are as updated as possible. Any voter registration in our office by that date is processed into the system and all changes and deletes are accomplished before officially closing our files. The 60 day close file is sent to the Secretary of State and the printer who prepares and mails San Luis Obispo County sample ballots. These names constitute the first mailing of state ballot pamphlets and sample ballot pamphlets. Any changes or anyone who registers between this date and the 29 day close of registration (May 10) will be mailed the voter information in the second mailing, scheduled for mailing the week of May 24th.
E-40	April 29	Sample Ballot booklets are mailed to voters who have not signed up to be a permanent vote-by-mail voter or do not live in a mail ballot precinct.
E-44 to E-20	April 26- May 19	Testing of voting machines and ballot counting software. Certification to transmit election night results to the Secretary of State.
E-29	May 10	The "informed voter" close of registration as well as the first day to issue vote-by-mail ballots. Vote-by-mail ballots are mailed to the 75,000 voters who are signed up a permanent VBM voters and to those who live in mail ballot precincts. During the week of the close of registration, staff is busy processing voter registrations. These must be completed by the end of the week so new voters can be sent their sample ballot booklets and state voter information guides in a timely manner. While this is going on the voting booths and precinct supplies are being prepared for delivery to the county's 137 precincts and last minute changes to precinct worker assignments are made. During the month of May, staff is conducting 15 training sessions for the 700+ volunteers working at the polls.
E-15	May 24	Official close of registration. Anyone registered

		between May 11 and May 24 is eligible to vote however, the voter will not receive the state voter information guide or the county sample ballot booklet. The voter will receive a postcard indicating their polling place location and where they can obtain voter information.
E-11	May 27	Elections staff begins opening and preparing the vote-by-mail ballots for counting.
E-10	May 28	Elections staff begins counting the vote-by-mail ballots. No results are released until after the close of polls on Election Night.
E-7	June 1	Copy of ballot counting software is deposited with the Secretary of State.
E-7	June 1	Last day to mail vote-by-mail ballots to voters. After this day, a voter must appear in the office to receive a ballot. The final week before the election precinct supplies are distributed to the precinct inspectors.
E-2	June 6	Delivery crew picks up voting booths, ballot box and other equipment for delivery to polls
E-1	June 7	Delivery crews delivers and sets up voting equipment at 72 polling places throughout the county.
E Day	June 8	Polls are open from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm Election day begins at 6:00 a.m. and should end around 1:00 am for the County Clerk-Recorder staff, although final election night results should be completed by 12:30 am
E+1	June 9	Delivery crew picks up and returns all voting equipment to the Elections warehouse. Election staff records number of outstanding vote-by-mail and provisional ballots
E+2	June 10	Official Canvass begins – see process outline below.
E+28	July 6	Official canvass completion and election certification deadline.

PRECINCT OFFICERS AND POLLING PLACES

The June 8, 2010 Direct Primary Election involves 137 precincts at 72 polling places and requires 700 volunteers to staff them. In San Luis Obispo County, we rely on public buildings and churches for our polling places. Using these buildings gives more stability to the polling place locations and does not leave the voters and precinct workers susceptible to poor weather and changes to locations because of vacations or illnesses. However, the demand for use of these buildings is great and, although our local agencies, schools and churches have been very cooperative in ensuring that we have sufficient space available,

some polling places may change from the last election due to scheduling conflicts. The voter's polling place location and address is listed on the back of their sample ballot booklet and voters are encouraged to check this information before going to the polls on election day. Polling place information is also available on the Internet at www.slocounty.ca.gov/clerk. The voter enters their residence address and zip code and the website will display the polling place as well as the candidates and measures that will appear on the ballot.

ELECTION NIGHT PROCEDURES

After the last voter in line at 8:00 has cast their ballot, the precinct workers pack up and return precinct materials and the voted ballots in sealed containers to either the regional collection centers or directly to the Elections office in San Luis Obispo. Elections staff verifies that all ballots and required materials have been received and that security measures have been followed prior to releasing the precinct workers. All ballots and materials are brought to the Government Center in San Luis Obispo for ballot counting and secure storage.

SPEED OF BALLOT COUNTING ELECTION NIGHT

As in the past, results of early vote-by-mail ballots (those received by Saturday, June 5th) will be available immediately after 8:00 pm. As in the May 2009 special election, the ballots will be counted centrally in the County Clerk-Recorder's office on Election Night instead of at the polls during the day. The ballots will be transported from our regional collection centers in Paso Robles, Atascadero, Morro Bay and Arroyo Grande and fed through the Accuvote scanners by county staff. Final election night results should be available by 12:30 a.m.

INCOMPLETE BALLOT COUNTING ELECTION NIGHT

The public is often surprised on the day after a major election when they learn that there are as many as 15,000 ballots county wide remaining to be counted after the election. There are three categories of ballots which cannot be processed on Election Night:

- 1. VOTE-BY-MAIL BALLOTS TURNED IN ELECTION DAY- Many vote-by-mail voters wait until Election Day to make their voting choices and then drop off their ballots at a polling place. These ballots are received after the polls close on election night. All vote-by-mail ballots must be pre-processed before they are counted- including entering that the ballot has been returned to protect against double voting and verifying every voter's signature against the signature on file in our office.
- 2. PROVISIONAL BALLOTS- Provisional Ballots are voted at the polls when the precinct workers cannot determine the voter's eligibility to vote in that election. Provisional ballots are sealed in special envelopes and must be individually researched and verified at the County Clerk-Recorder's Office before the ballots is counted or rejected in accordance with election laws. There are several reasons why someone would be required to vote a provisional ballot at the polling location:

Voter is listed as having received a vote-by-mail ballot yet does not have the ballot to surrender at the polls.
Voter is voting under the fail safe provisions of the National Voting Rights Act. A fail safe voter is a registered voter in this county, who has moved and did not re-register to vote or notify the elections office of his/her change of address.
Voter's name is not on the roster, but the voter insists they are eligible to vote in that precinct.
Voter is required to show identification as a first time voter under the Help America Vote Act and cannot produce the required identification.
The voter insists their party affiliation listed on the roster is incorrect and wishes to vote a different party ballot.

In each of these instances, the elections staff must verify that the voter is eligible to vote the ballot they were issued and verify the voter's signature prior to opening the ballot for processing. The number of provisional ballots continues to climb and in the November 2008 election there were 3,716 provisional ballots requiring about 400 hours of staff time to verify, open and count.

3. DAMAGED BALLOTS: Election Day ballots that are unable to be processed by the ballot scanners and need to be duplicated.

The majority of the vote-by-mail ballots are counted by the Friday after the election. Some of these ballots require additional processing and their count is completed in the week following the election. The provisional and damaged ballots are normally counted just prior to certification of the results. Results are released as a count is completed and a schedule of counting dates and times will be posted on the County Clerk-Recorder website after the election.

WRAPPING UP THE ELECTION WHAT IS THE OFFICIAL CANVASS?

The election canvass process is an internal audit required by state law to ensure the accuracy of election results. California election law allows 28 days to conduct the official canvass of final election results. The official canvass begins on Thursday, June 10 and must be concluded within 28 days, no later than July 6. San Luis Obispo County normally completes the official canvass within 17 days of the election. All aspects of the canvass are open to the public. The canvass concludes with the certification and issuance of official election results. Listed below are the major components of the official canvass.

Completion of the count for vote-by-mail and provisional ballots- as described above.

Election Materials accounted for- Staff verifies that all elections materials have been returned and accounted for and that precinct workers have correctly followed Election Day procedures.

Roster Reconciliation- Following the close of the polls on Election Day, precinct officers are responsible for completing the Official Ballot Statement shown below.

As part of the official canvass, the signatures in each roster are re-counted and the number of signatures indicated by the inspector on the roster is compared to the number of ballots tabulated by the computer tally system. Any discrepancies are investigated. The balancing process normally takes 10 days to complete.

Manual Vote Tally- All voted ballots, including vote-by-mail ballots, from 1% of the 137 precincts are manually tallied and balanced against the computer counts to verify the accuracy of the election tally system. The completion of the manual tally usually takes 2-4 days, depending on the number of contests on the ballot and the voter turnout.

Apply Voting History- All voters who voted at the polls are given credit for voting.

Account for all ballots- The number of precinct and vote-by-mail ballots printed, issued and unused are accounted for and balanced. Discrepancies are investigated.

Certify Election and report to the Secretary of State - Registrar of Voters certifies the Election and sends the certification, statement of vote and supplemental statement of vote to the Secretary of State. Board item is prepared to present to the Board of Supervisors.

IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS MEASURE A-10

Measure A-10 was unanimously placed on the ballot by the Arroyo Grande City Council to ask voters to approve issuing and selling general obligation bonds in an amount up to \$6,000,000 to construct a new Police Station facility. California law authorizes cities to issue general obligation bonds to finance "municipal improvements", including the construction of police stations. The proposed new 30 year bond issue includes an amount sufficient to retire the bonds that were issued in 2003 to construct the Fire Station.

The proposed funding includes repaying the bonds partly through a real property tax at a tax assessment rate equal to or below the existing tax rate for the Fire Station bonds, and also using funds from the 2006 Local Sales Tax Measure to pay the balance of the bond payment. Funding is also based upon purchase of the bonds by the U.S. Department of Agriculture through a low-interest community facility financing program, for which a preliminary application has been approved.

The real property tax would be assessed on the value of commercial, residential, industrial, agricultural and utility property within the City. According to the tax rate statement provided by the City's financial consultant, the best estimate of highest annual tax rate to property owners is \$8.20 for each \$100,000 of assessed value, which is the current tax rate for the Fire Station bonds.

The existing police station was acquired in 1973 and was last expanded in 1989. Since 1973, staffing has grown from 12 full-time and 6 part-time employees to 36 full-time and 20 part-time employees in 2010. The proposed new Police Station will meet the following needs that have been identified by City staff: an emergency operations center, expansion of the dispatch center, expansion of evidence and equipment storage and additional parking for police vehicles and staff. The City has entered into an agreement with the County of San Luis Obispo to acquire property for the proposed new Police Station at no cost.

A "yes" vote is a vote in favor of authorizing the City of Arroyo Grande to issue general obligation bonds not to exceed the principal amount of \$6,000,000 to retire the 2003 Fire Station bonds and construct a new Police Station.

A "no" vote is a vote to not authorize the issuance and sale of said bonds.

The Measure will pass if two-thirds of those voting on the measure vote "yes".

TAX RATE STATEMENT MEASURE A-10

An election will be held in the City of Arroyo Grande (the "City") on June 8, 2010, to authorize the sale of up to \$6,000,000 in bonds by the City to finance construction of a new Police Station and refinance the 2003 Fire Station bonds as described in the proposition. If the bonds are approved, the City expects to sell the bonds in single series in calendar year 2010. Principal of and interest on the bonds will be payable in part from the proceeds of tax levies made upon the taxable property in the City. The following information is provided in compliance with Sections 9400-9405 of the Elections Code of the State of California.

- 1. The best estimate of the tax which would be required to be levied to fund this bond issue during the first fiscal year after the sale of the bonds, based on estimated assessed valuations available at the time of filing of this statement, is .00820 cents per \$100 assessed valuation (\$8.20 per \$100,000 of assessed valuation) in fiscal year 2011-12.
- 2. The best estimate of the highest tax rate which would be required to be levied to fund this bond issue, based on estimated assessed valuations available at the time of filing of this statement, is .00820 cents per \$100 assessed valuation (\$8.20 per \$100,000 of assessed valuation) in fiscal year 2011-12.

Voters should note that it is the intention of the City to pay a portion of annual bond payments with revenues from the 2006 Local Sales Tax Measure so as to maintain the tax rate at or below the existing tax rate for the Fire Station Bonds, which is currently .00820 cents per \$100 assessed valuation.

Voters should note that the estimated tax rates are based on the *assessed value* of taxable property on the official tax roles of the city, <u>not</u> on the property's market value. In addition, taxpayers eligible for a property tax exemption, such as the homeowner's exemption, will be taxed at a lower effective tax rate than described above. Property owners should consult their own property tax bills and tax advisors to determine their property's assessed value and any applicable tax exemptions.

Attention of all voters is directed to the fact that the foregoing information is based on the City's current projections and estimates only. The actual tax rates and the years in which they will apply may vary from those presently estimated, due to variations from these estimates in the timing of the bond sale, the amount of bonds sold, interest rates at the time of bond sale, and actual assessed valuations over the term of repayment of the bonds. The date of sale and the amount of bonds sold will be determined by the City based on need for construction funds and other factors. The actual interest rate at which the bonds will be sold, not to exceed 5% per annum, will depend on the bond market at the time of sale. Actual future assessed valuations will depend upon the amount of taxable property within the City as determined by the County Assessor in the annual assessment and the equalization process.

ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF MEASURE A-10

Your "YES" vote on Measure A-10 will provide funding to construct a much needed new Police Station at West Branch Street and Rodeo Drive. The project and financing have been designed to ensure it is completed in the most cost effective way possible without raising your annual tax rates.

The Arroyo Grande Police Department has a distinguished history of keeping our community safe by providing outstanding public safety services. However, important facilities are needed to continue to accomplish this.

The Police Department has grown to meet the community's needs since the existing building began housing the City's police force in 1973. As a result, it no longer has adequate space to perform necessary functions. Upgrade and expansion of the emergency operations center, 9-1-1, emergency communications, detective offices, evidence and equipment storage, and parking are needed.

An independent study determined construction of a new station is the most cost effective option to address these needs. It is important to construct the project at this time to take advantage of current low construction costs. To further minimize costs, property was acquired at no additional expense to the City through an innovative agreement with the County, and the existing station will be sold to generate a portion of the revenue needed.

The remainder of funding will be generated by issuing bonds. In order to repay the bonds without raising property tax rates, bonds issued in 2003 to expand the Fire Station will be refinanced for a 30 year term. The balance of debt costs will be paid from local sales tax proceeds from the 2006 ballot measure.

Arroyo Grande citizens depend on the Police Department for protection. Now officers are depending on you to provide them the facilities needed to do their job. Your City Council strongly urges you to vote "YES" on Measure A-10.
