WHAT'S NEW FOR THIS ELECTION

Top Two Primary

What is it?

In 2010, California voters approved Proposition 14 creating the "Top-Two Primary," which replaced the traditional party-nominated primary. Under the Top-Two Primary laws, all candidates running, regardless of their party preference, appear on a single combined ballot, and voters can vote for any candidate from any political party. The candidates who receive the highest and second-highest number of votes cast at the Primary election advance to the General election. This change applies to federal and state contests, except for President. The rules for non-partisan contests (i.e. counties, cities, school and special districts) did not change.

For the Presidential Primary, Party Ballots Still Exist

Since the Top Two Primary rules do not affect the election of party nominee for President, party-specific ballots will be issued for this Presidential Primary Election. Only voters who are registered to vote with a specific party are allowed to vote in that party's Presidential nominee contest.

All Other Contests Are Open to All Voters

The new rules apply to U.S. Senate, U.S. Congressional, statewide and state legislative offices. Candidates for these offices are no longer nominated by party. As a result, voters can vote for any candidate on the ballot regardless of the candidate's party preference. These contests are now referred to as "voter-nominated offices." Again, in these contests, only the two candidates who receive the highest and second-highest vote totals will be on the ballot in the November General Election.

Party Preference and Political Party Endorsement

The term "party preference" is now used in place of the term "party affiliation". Similarly, voters who were previously known as "decline-to-state" voters (because they did not have a party affiliation) are now known as "no party preference" or "NPP" voters.

On the ballot, the political party preference, or no party preference, as indicated on the candidate's voter registration will be listed next to or below the candidate's name. The party designation is shown on the ballot for the information of the voters only and it does not constitute or imply an endorsement by the party designated. Parties may provide SBVBM-PNW1

a list of candidates for voter-nominated offices, who have received the official endorsement of the party for printing in this booklet.

Write-In Candidates

Write-in candidates are eligible to run in the Primary, and voters can cast their vote for that candidate by writing in the candidate's name and filling in the oval next to the write-in line. If a qualified write-in candidate is one of the top two candidates, under the new rule, that candidate will advance to and have their name printed on the General election ballot.

Changes due to Redistricting

After the 2010 decennial census, all legislative district lines for federal, state and county offices were redrawn. These lines have been put into place and the candidates on the ballot which you are issued are determined by the district in which you reside. Voters in San Luis Obispo County remain in one state senate district (the 17th) and one assembly district (the 35th). The county is once again represented by one congressional district (the 24th). In addition, the lines designating the 5 districts represented by the Board of Supervisors were redrawn and your residence may now be located in a different district than before. Digest-Sized Booklet

The first thing you may have noticed is that the booklet is half the size of those in previous elections. This is due to recent changes which increased postage to send full-sized booklets. By reformatting our booklets to the "digest-sized" booklet, the county will be sending the sample ballot at the most efficient postage rates.



Sample Ballot Layout

In order to accommodate the digest-sized booklet format and still be readable, the sample ballot showing all contests on your ballot is laid out across multiple pages.

The sample ballot does not look exactly like the official ballot you will be voting, but the contests are laid out in the booklet in the same order as the official ballot. The partisan contests, if applicable, will be listed first followed by contests for the Voter-Nominated and Non-Partisan contests, State Propositions and any Local Measures.

...that all dogs in the County of San Luis Obispo over the age of 4 months are required to be licensed?

If you haven't done so already, licensing your dog is easy! You can download a license application in the "Forms" section at: www.sloanimalservices.com and mail it in. You can also license your dog online at www.petdata.com, or come into the Animal Services office at 885 Oklahoma Ave. in San Luis Obispo.

WHY LICENSE YOUR DOG?

- ♦ Your dog's license is his ticket home if he is ever picked up running at large. Animal Control Officers would rather reunite you with your pet than impound him. If he's wearing a current license, they'll bring him home instead of to the shelter.
- ♦ License revenues help support Animal Services efforts to address the needs of homeless and neglected pets and to resolve our community's animal related problems.
- ♦ It's the law.

HELPFUL INFORMATION FOR LICENSING YOUR DOG

- ◆ State law requires all dogs to have a current rabies vaccination before they can be licensed. If your dog doesn't have license information on file with Animal Services, you will need to submit it with your application.
- ♦ By law, the duration of your dog's license validity cannot exceed the expiration date of his current rabies vaccine.
- ◆ The metal tag your vet gives you when your pet is vaccinated *is not* a license tag.
- ♦ License fees are significantly discounted if your dog has been spayed or neutered.

HELPFUL HINTS MAKE ELECTION DAY EASIER!

Your precinct workers are citizens like you. They sincerely want to make voting easy while protecting your voting rights and ensuring that all election laws are followed. Here are some ideas for you to make Election Day easier for all.

- Your polling place is listed on the back page of this Sample Ballot booklet. It may have changed since the last election.
- If you are not planning on voting by mail, check to make sure you know where your polling place is located. If you are not sure how to locate your polling place, go to our polling place look-up on the web (www.slocounty.ca.gov/clerk) or contact us before Election Day, if possible.
- Go to the polls prepared. Read and mark the contests prior to Election Day and take this Sample Ballot booklet with you to refer to while you are in the voting booth. This is especially helpful with a lengthy ballot and can also help the precinct workers locate your name and address on the voter roster.
- If you are a first time voter, be prepared to show identification, see below.

NEW REQUIREMENTS FOR FIRST TIME VOTERS

The Help America Vote Act requires first time voters to show identification when voting. If you registered to vote by mail after January 1, 2003 and have not previously voted in San Luis Obispo County you will be required to show your current valid photo I.D. or a copy of one of the following that shows your name and address when you go to the polls on election day: Current Utility Bill, Bank Statement, Government Check, Government Paycheck or a Government Document. The same requirement applies if you request to vote by absentee ballot. You will be required to send a copy of one of the above with your voted vote-by-mail ballot. If you have questions about your status as a First Time Voter, contact us.

The San Luis Obispo County Clerk-Recorder wants to help you create a voting plan that works for you. See your options below!

- Vote at the Polls Polling places are open from 7 am 8 pm on Election Day. We recommend that you bring your completed sample ballot to help you save time. The information on the back cover can also help the precinct workers find your name and address in the voting roster.
 - You can find your polling place on your sample ballot or our website at www.slocounty.ca.gov/clerk
- 2. Vote by Mail Sign up by completing the application in your sample ballot, or by sending a request. Return the application well before the election so you have time to complete and return your ballot. Mail your ballot in early, or drop it off at any polling place to be received by 8 pm on Election Day.
 - You can also request to permanently vote by mail, and you will receive a mail-in ballot automatically for each election.



Assistance for Voters with Special Needs



San Luis Obispo offers voters with disabilities options that provide a private and independent voting environment.

- Check the accessibility of your polling place or the status or your vote-by-mail ballot at www.slocounty.ca.gov/clerk
- AutoMARK Ballot Marking Machines are available in every polling place on Election Day and at the County Clerk-Recorder's Office 22 days prior to the election for early voting.
- Curbside voting is also available. If you arrive at your polling place and cannot get to the voting area, ask for assistance.

Other Assistance for Visually, Hearing or Speech Impaired:

The Secretary of State's Office has a TDD (Telecommunications Device for the Deaf) to provide elections information: **1-800-833-8683 (1-800-TDD-VOTE)**. Audio tapes and large print format of the state ballot measures and audio tapes of local measures and candidates are available from the Clerk-Recorder's Department.

Sample Ballot Opt Out

Voters can now "Opt Out" of receiving a sample ballot, voter pamphlet (information guide), notice of polling place, and associated materials by mail, and instead obtain them electronically on the County's Website.

By opting out you will reduce the number of booklets to be printed and mailed (about 50-70 cents each) and be sensitive to the environment

About a month prior to Election Day, the Clerk-Recorder will directly email to voters, as well as post announcements on the Clerk-Recorder's Twitter and Facebook accounts, that this information is available online.

Two ways to "Opt Out" of receiving these materials in the mail:

- Check the box on the attached postcard (be sure to sign the form and furnish an email) and return it to the Clerk-Recorder's office.
- 2) Send a message by emailing the Clerk-Recorder's office requesting to Opt Out of receiving the Sample Ballot in the mail. You must provide your name as it appears on the voter rolls, residence address, and either California driver's license or ID number or last four numbers of your Social Security Number in your request (as required by law).

If you decide later that you would like to resume receiving these materials by mail for future elections, you may "Opt In" by contacting the Clerk-Recorder's office.

REQUESTING A VOTE BY MAIL BALLOT

If you find that for any reason you will be unable to vote in person on Election Day, promptly complete and sign the application for a vote by mail ballot printed on the reverse side of this page, detach the post card, apply postage and mail. Your application must reach the office of the **Clerk-Recorder** not less than 7 days before the day of election. The deadline for the Clerk-Recorder to receive Vote By Mail applications is May 29, 2012.

PERMANENT VOTE BY MAIL QUALIFICATION

State law now allows any voter, upon written request, to be a Permanent Vote By Mail Voter. If you check the Permanent Vote By Mail box on the Application for Vote By Mail Ballot, a vote by mail ballot will automatically be sent to you for future elections. Failure to vote in four consecutive statewide general elections may cancel your Permanent Vote By Mail Status and you will need to reapply.

RETURNING YOUR VOTE BY MAIL BALLOT

Voters may return only their own voted vote by mail ballot, in person or by mail, to the Clerk-Recorder's Office. On Election Day the ballot can be returned to any polling place in the County. To be counted, a ballot must be received no later than the close of the polls at 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. However, a voter who us unable to return his/her ballot because of illness or other physical disability, may designate his/her spouse, child, parent, grandparent, grandchild, sibling or a person residing in the same household as the voter to return the ballot to the Clerk-Recorder or any election day polling place in San Luis Obispo County.
